

During the last month or so, Neil Woffinden has had a ball flying this Stik-E electric which he built from a kit from Global Lits. Ken Reese built it many years ago, but it was powered by NiCad batteries and a brushed motor. Ken said it never flew very well with that suggested set-up. The plane was designed by Randy Wrisley and is about a .20 size ugly stick.

The plane has a 44 inch wingspan and now its powered by a .10 size electric motor from Value Hobby. Neil used a 40A BEC and a 2200 mah 30C battery, which he also got from Value Hobby. Mini-servos from Tower Hobbies were installed and it's controlled with a 7 channel Futuba 2.4 transmitter. The receive is a standard 7 channel Futaba model. He started out using a 10 x 7 prop, but found it too fast with that prop and went to a 10 x 5 which really flies it very well, with plenty of speed. quick, and handles the wind quite well, and is really a blast to fly. Both Ken and Neil have plans for this plane and since it's still an ugly stick design it's fairly simple and quick to build. Neil still likes glow airplanes, but this thing is his current "Go To" plane for a quick trip to the field!
